



# A Trainees Guide to the Dental Specialties Generic Curriculum Passport

### What is the passport?

- The new Dental Specialty Curricula were introduced in September 2024
- All trainees starting Specialty Training and any trainees transitioning from old to new curriculum now need to evidence how they meet the generic competencies
- The passport documents your evidence to meet these competencies and will be used by your ARCP panel to assess your progress in training

#### How do I use it?

- At the start of training review each of the domains
- Decide what evidence you already have to meet each competency and list/ link to the evidence
- Identify where you have gaps and plan how you will fill these
- Upload evidence throughout training
- At each meeting with your ES review the passport and update the traffic light review
- Make sure your passport is fully up to date in preparation for your ARCP

### Where should I upload it?

- In the 'Other Evidence' section of ISCP
- Under 'Miscellaneous'
- Under the title 'Generic Curriculum Passport'

### Important Information

- 1. Attendance at a course alone is not sufficient to demonstrate competency
- 2. You will require a WBA or written reflection to demonstrate what has been learnt and how it may have changed practice
- 3. If project work is undertaken as part of a course this can be submitted as evidence of skills learnt
- 4. You can't do it all at once plan out how you will meet each competence over the course of your training programme
- 5. Be selective about the courses you attend you don't have to go on a course for many of these competencies

- 6. Find out what your Deanery has available to you for free or what you can access on e-LfH
- 7. The list of options for each domain is not exhaustive, these are simply examples
- 8. You don't need to do everything on the list!
- 9. Just because you have 'fully achieved' a competence it doesn't mean you can't add more evidence
- 10. On occasion a competency may move from 'fully achieved' to 'partially achieved' at your ES's request if an adverse event occurs or there is feedback which relates to that competency
