

Queries Relating to HALOs:

I've had number of queries recently from trainees and trainers regarding HALOs. The college set the standards for this-please ensure you are familiar with the HALO assessment guidance on their website:

https://rcoa.ac.uk/documents/2021-curriculum-assessment-guidance/holistic-assessment-learning-outcomes-halos

Common themes of these queries were either the timing of HALO completion or the content of evidence required. For the timing, the college response is copy-and-pasted below. For the GA and Peri Op HALOs, I suggest closing these mid-ST7, accepting there will be a peak of HALO activity for both trainees and trainers:

'More succinct domains such as Pain, Procedural Sedation and even Regional Anaesthesia may be completed ahead of the end of the stage of training. However, General Anaesthesia and Perioperative Medicine and Health Promotion are likely to be completed nearer to the end of the stage of training'

Regarding the evidence required for HALO completion, the college have provided the following statement on the same website:

'How do you determine appropriate clinical exposure/logbook contents for HALO sign off? Will there be standardisation nationally or across schools?'

There is guidance on the experience required in the Assessment Guidance. Schools can adapt this HALO guidance according to local circumstances but the anaesthetist in training will still need to meet the key capabilities at the supervision level advised.'

I think this is paragraph is important when assessing the evidence in each HALO, again taken from the college website:

'Towards the end of the stage of training if the anaesthetist in training does not have an SLE which demonstrates the required supervision level, the HALO can still be completed if the assessment faculty agree that the trainee is performing safely at the required level. This should be supported by the Multiple Trainer Report feedback.

'A HALO cannot be approved if there is no evidence linked to a cluster or individual key capability. All clusters or individual key capabilities should have some form of evidence linked.'

- *Please note you can only apply for LTFT, under the below grounds, within the windows for your rotation Month:
 - · Welfare and wellbeing
 - Unique opportunities
 - Religious commitment
 - Non-medical development
 - Flexibility for training and career development

Please ensure you discuss all applications with your TPD prior to submitting your application form.

Notice period for LTFT: 16weeks for grounds you can apply for throughout the year, and within the rotation windows for the remaining grounds above.
