Overview

The scheme is entering its seventh year. As a relatively new scheme it has rapidly established a reputation for being forward thinking, innovative, creative and focused on developing the professional person's readiness for the job market. Study days provide a balanced and blended programme of hands-on clinical skills; interactive, small group teaching and learning sessions with speakers and Educational Supervisors - a variety that makes your DFT year interesting, challenging and importantly, fun! You are expected to be proactive and self-directed in your learning. You will be expected to contribute debate, challenge current thinking and justify your reasoning. You will present to a wide variety of audiences. The study days are your days and the more you participate the more you will gain.

The scheme is ideally suited for both those wishing to live in London and those looking for more affordable accommodation but still wanting easy access to the capital's attractions. Less than 30 minutes by train from London (King's Cross), and 5 minutes off the A1, there are excellent transport links and easy commuting to the hospital for study days. Please note that the 'clinical skills' study days are held in Kettering Hospital Postgraduate Centre
