<p>Local Allocation Process</p>	<p>You will preference the specific practice and community pairing and will be allocated based on your national ranking.</p> <p>All successful trainees will be sent a link, after recruitment has been completed, which will contain the practice and community pairing profiles. This will take place early July. The trainee will then rank all of the rotations and will be advised of their allocated rotation on week commencing 11 July.</p>
<p>Overview</p>	<p>Training outcomes from the community placement will focus on paediatric & special care dentistry as well as an opportunity to participate in an epidemiological programme. There will be an opportunity to attend paediatric dental GA assessment clinics and Paediatric consultant clinics run within the CDS during the placement.</p> <p>The trainee will acquire appropriate knowledge, skills and attitudes and judgement to meet the oral health needs of individuals and groups in society who have a physical, sensory, intellectual, mental, medical, emotional or social impairment or disability.</p> <p>Summary of training and Educational/training objectives in community placement include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To be exposed to and become proficient in the management of children and adults with special needs. 2. Gain experience in a wide range of areas within dentistry, including restorative, prosthetic, periodontal, preventive and paediatric. 3. To gain experience in behaviour management techniques required to provide oral care for people with special needs including the appropriate use of local anaesthesia and conscious sedation. 4. Gain experience in the management of dental emergency patients. 5. Develop skills needed for audit, quality improvement projects and for general administrative duties.

6. Develop skills in delivering preventive programmes and in collaborating with multi-professional teams

All foundation trainees will have access to state-of-the-art simulation facilities across London & Kent, Surrey and Sussex including phantom head skills labs and simulation suite for training in medical emergency & crisis resource management. HEE London & KSS runs a comprehensive induction for all FDs which includes the opportunity to refresh hands on skills in the simulation facilities, before starting clinical work at the start of the training year. Most study days will be practical based.

All FDs will have the opportunity to be involved in a range of community-based preventive projects as well as evidence-based projects.

Note: HEE London & KSS operate a stringent policy on annual leave. Annual leave is not permitted during term times and attendance on all study days is compulsory. All foundation dentists must also attend the full study programme and work full time in practice including working on non-study days at the practice.

Foundation dentists are paid according to the nationally agreed salary in each of the three UK countries involved in this nationally coordinated recruitment process:

- For England and Wales the exact figure appears in the Statements of Financial Entitlement published periodically by the Departments of Health for England and Wales. For Northern Ireland this is published in the Statement of Dental Remuneration (SDR).
