Local Allocation Process followed in 2020 (This may be subject to alteration for 2022).

Following Dental Foundation National Recruitment, successful applicants will be allocated to a Dental Foundation training scheme by Health Education England based on the interview ranking results.

The local allocation of successful applicants to individual training practices within our schemes will be achieved using the following process:

- Information on all training practices will be available on our <u>website</u> from late April 2022 in the form of an interactive scheme map
- All allocated applicants will be given access to an online folder which contains information on the scheme Educational Supervisors and practices.
- All allocated applicants will be invited to a half day event on Thursday 7 July, 9.30 12.30, in Durham
 where they will have the opportunity to hear a three minute presentation from each Educational
 Supervisor allocated to their scheme followed by a five minute individual meeting
- Applicants will complete an online preference form ranking all the scheme training practices.
- All preference forms will then be collated and the Dental Directorate will allocate Foundation Dentists to training practices based on national recruitment ranking. Anyone who does not submit their preferencing will be allocated a Training practice once all submitted preferencing requests have been processed. Notification of pairings will be received by 5pm Friday 15 July.

While many practices are well within the boundaries of the Tyne and Wear area others are to be found in some of the charming Northumberland market towns and elsewhere, all of which sit within easy commuting distance of Newcastle and Bourne House.

This year the study day curriculum has been adapted to blend a rich mixture of scheme based study days with multi-scheme days using the feedback from previous Foundation Dentists to guide our content. We have been privileged to attract high calibre speakers to the North East study days such as Professor Michael Lewis and Professor Paul Redmond. Feedback from Foundation Dentists in programme planning help ensure we deliver programmes to meet your needs within the Dental Foundation curriculum.

Modifications have been put in place within the Dental Education Centre to ensure it is COVID safe for all staff and visitors which has allowed us to continue to deliver face to face teaching.

Educational Supervisors recognise the importance of team spirit and work together to make this a reality to ensure no one is left out. Social events are organised by the Educational Supervisors so improve team bonding.

With one of the highest rates of NHS dental provision in the country, only the best practices and Educational Supervisors are selected to be part of our schemes. All of our Educational Supervisors have undertaken or are currently completing a recognised teaching qualification.
