Main duties of the placement

You will spend three days a week working as part of the Palliative care team at Kingston Hospital and two days a week with the team at Princess Alice Hospice, in order to gain an understanding of cross boundary care.

At Kingston Hospital, palliative care is an advisory service. This means that we work alongside clinical teams in the hospital, offering advice and support to staff on the wards. We do not have a palliative care ward and there are no inpatients admitted under the palliative care consultants.

At both Kingston Hospital and Princess Alice Hospice, you will work as part of the multi-disciplinary team, clinically reviewing inpatients and implementing a management plan. You will carry out single and joint reviews with other colleagues, and accompany palliative care consultants on ward rounds. You will liaise with community palliative care and take part in the weekly palliative care MDT.

You will review patients in the Emergency Department and Acute Assessment Unit at Kingston Hospital and experience 'front door' palliative care. You may have the opportunity to spend time with the community team at Princess Alice Hospice.

You will develop skills in recognising and diagnosing dying, understanding the difference between palliative care and end of life care, prescribing opioids and end of life injectable medications including syringe drivers and being able to deliver holistic, person centred care with complex MDT working. You will have the opportunity to develop advanced communication skills and knowledge of cross boundary working (across hospital and community).

There are opportunities for education, teaching, quality improvement activities and management experience as detailed above.
