Department	The Department of Adult Medicine includes several subspecialties, most of which include both in and out patient commitments. We have major links with St Thomas' and Kings College Hospital. The Acute Medical Unit consists of 31 beds (3 side rooms and 5 cubicles). This unit has a very high turnover and has a variety of patients presenting to the hospital. The majority of the patients are new patients admitted to the hospital who are referred from the Emergency Department, are direct GP referrals or through the Ambulatory Care Unit.
