Conclusion

- You will be very well supported on this job and you will learn a lot of general medicine as there is a very high turnover of patients.
- For each new patient make a summary including: date and reason for admission, full PMHx, SHx, FHx, AMTS, problem list, all relevant investigations, and dates of recent admissions. Print out recent discharge summaries and check gcis for other clinic letters/ STARRS assessments. Check body map has been done by nursing staff and that relevant care bundles are in place. Always find out the patients baseline and discuss ceilings of care early with the Consultant.

Department	General surgery is run as an 'Emergency Surgical Unit', there is no distinction between upper and lower GI with all patients coming under the acute consultants and F1s work for all 6 of the Emergency Surgery Consultants. There is usually 2 F1s working per week as one is often on leave and the other in HDU.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Working hours are Monday - Friday 8-6, 2 weeks of HDU (8-5), one week of zero days with no on calls or weekend. F1s work for the 'chronic team', on a monday and Friday morning there is a handover meeting where patients who have had their operation or surgical management are handed from the acute on call team to the chronic team for continued surgical management. These days are often busy with a lot of TTAs, organising of investigations. One F1 normally goes on this "post take" ward round and the other stays with the chronic patients that have rolled over from the week before.
	Other days morning ward round with a registrar to see patients, see unwell patients, carry out jobs, board round at 4pm.
	Generally days are busy with lots of jobs and managing unwell patients which is good for clinical exposure and improving your time management skills.
	Large team of nurse practitioners work with team who often help do bloods, cannulas, organise investigations, able to prescribe / order imaging.
	Limited clerking experience. High turnover of patients means that F1s are continually being exposed to a reasonable level of unwell patients.

Referrals are made most often by the GP or ambulance service. The Early Supported Discharge team facilitates the safe discharge of patients from hospital, reducing length of stay.

CPAU is for a quick turnover of uncomplicated chest pain patients. There are two F1s and 2 SHOs on the ward. The Cath lab and Echo rooms are located very close to the ward.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	F1s are generally ward based throughout their weekly schedule and are expected to look after all aspects of patient care, admin work and seeking help from the relevant medical/surgical specialty when needed.

Main duties of the placement	Daily ward rounds. There are daily registrar led ward rounds. Consultant ward rounds are infrequent. Usually an SHO leads the ward round but the F1 can be expected to conduct ward rounds independently occasionally. Senior advice is not difficult to obtain as there is always a ward registrar.
	After the ward round they will need to carry out relevant jobs including booking investigations, specialty referrals, chasing results and working with MDT to ensure successful and timely discharge of patients.
	One cardiology F1 will have to attend the CPAU ward round daily, ensure jobs for these patients are completed and then help with the jobs for the other ward patients.

F1/SHOs are expected to summarise patients and have all cardiology investigations printed out for ward round. Bloods should also be noted prior to ward round. 	rounds. Every Tuesday there is a weekly Joint Cardiology-Cardiothoracic (JCC) meeting, where patients considered for cardiac surgery are discussed. During the consultant ward round, jobs include scribing/doing jobs generated. This can include blood, investigations requests, consultant referrals. After the ward round any practical procedures e.g Ascitic drains/taps and TTA's can be done. In the afternoon, we then update the list with bloods and outcomes of any investigations. We usually have a paper round with the reg/SHOs in the afternoon as well to update the whole team (this is very much dependent on the team).

- Most patients will be put onto Adcal D3 and Alendronate as their bone protection post NOF
- If they have oesophagitis, or history of GI bleeding, hold the Alendronate and check with Dr B
- Similarly if they are relatively young, then you might want to investigate it prior to starting bone protection: eGFR, DEXA scan and refer them to Rheumatology who will review
- Patients with #NOFs should be being mobilised after day 3 post op with physiotherapy
- Transfer to CMH Gladstone 4 if main barrier to going home is mobilisation
- Fill in a yellow form (ask the nurses) called 'Patient transfer document', with the main pre and peri operative problems
- Sometimes we give them a call to handover too
 numbersat the bottom of the handover sheet
- #NOF patients aren't technically yours so you don't have to do the EDNs
- Usually we do a little 'Orthogeris input' section in the notes bit and add anything that's happened in hospital
- We have a Handover list on the Desktop folder of the middle computer in Evelyn ward; under the name 'Dr Bhattacharyya'. This is the one you update everyday.
- There is a reg 50% of the time, they are split with hardy ward and don't have a bleep. Though can always contact by mobile so not a problem
- Handover to 167 at the end of the day

On Calls

- Jobs for Orthogeriatric patients are handed-over to the Ortho SHO on-call at 5pm (bleep 024)
- WEEKEND: Leave two lists pinned on the board in the trauma room for the Ortho SHO. Leave one list in the green folder in Dickens for the Care of the Elderly weekend cover (does not normally review Orthogeriatric pts) in case they are asked to review the patient by Ortho.
- F1s: You are on the medical on call rota

In addition to general ward jobs, the F2 is responsible for clerking and examining all acute admissions that arise from the south sector of Brent.

The F2 will also be on the on call rota which includes working late shifts, long weekends and nights. When on this duty they are responsible for clerking all acute admissions that come through A&E that have a psychiatry referral, direct admissions and assessing the patients held under Section 136 brought in by the Police, as well as attending to any needs of the inpatients at Park Royal Centre for Mental Health.

The F2 is responsible for making sure all the relevant risk assessments and Honos forms are completed for every admission. They also ensure a part 1 discharge summary is written within 7 days of every ward based admission and they must complete part 2 within 7 days of discharge.
