Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Primarily ward based work (e.g. taking blood, ordering investigations, cannulation and making referrals). You need to make sure you are familiar with all patients on the ward and that all bloods and other investigations are up to date. •The FY1 is mainly responsible for ensuring that emergency admissions for general surgical problems (including those from Theatres) are managed correctly as well as looking after the surgical patients on Syon 1 and 2 wards and completing any relevant paperwork such as discharge summaries. •The majority of the FY1 work is with general surgical patients rather than breast surgery patients. •A typical day involves a morning ward round, then jobs along with chasing of results. •On elective operative days you also manage the post operative care of patients who have extended stays. You may also be asked to attend Theatre on these days to assist seniors. •You are also required to be available for emergency surgical procedures. •Involved in weekly Breast MDT meeting. Prepare presentations for this meeting as well as weekly Surgical Academic meeting. •Opportunities to attend clinics when the wards are less busy. •On calls involve ward cover most of the time but some opportunities to clerk in A&E. •Providing cover for the Urology FY1 as and when necessary.

	As it is a teaching trust as well as learning on the job you will also be expected to teach medical students, which is a good way to revise topics as it is all too easy to fall into bad habits passed along from seniors.

Department	There are four endocrinology and diabetes consultants, who have general medical inpatients covering 'Winter pressures' admissions. This usually lasts for 8 months of the year. There are three registrars (two diabetes and endocrinology SpRs and one renal SpR), a GP trainee and an F1. F1s rotate with MAU (Acute Medicine), spending approximately 2 months on the general medical ward and 2 months on MAU, subject to requirements and inpatient numbers. In the 4 months when the DM/Endo Consultants have no inpatients, the FY1 will be attached to the Gastroenterology medical team.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>You will be the link between the team and the inpatients as you will see them regularly (registrars and consultants work on a rota covering the ward). You are also the link between the family and the medical team as families aren't often on the ward during ward round but will be later in the day. You will be updating the list and ensuring the plans the consultant and senior doctors' advice get put into action, so you may be interacting with many departments in the hospital. Placement details (i.e. the specialty and sub-specialty)	F1 Psychiatry Assessment Ward and Early Intervention Service
Department	The post is based on Sapphire Assessment Ward, Highgate Mental Health Centre and the trainee will work within a multidisciplinary team. This is the busy 16-bed acute admission ward for Camden and Islington and averages about 100 admissions a month. The post also inputs into the Early Intervention Service (EIS) which is community based service dedicated to the assessment and management of people with a first episode of psychosis. There are two consultants on Sapphire Ward (Dr Petros Lekkos and Dr Janet Obeney-Williams), three Specialist Trainees (ST4-6) and two Core Trainees (CT1-3). There is also one additional F1 doctor on placement there. There is a multi-disciplinary team comprising: Nursing staff and Care Workers, OTs and Psychologists, a Ward Manager and administrative staff. The junior trainees are present on ward on most of the days. There is a consultant-led ward round on every weekday. Dr Ahmed is the Consultant for the EIS. There is a Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist (for those aged 16-18 years), a Specialty doctor, social workers, nurses and OTs.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>When based at the in-patient ward, the F1 will be involved in assessing and monitoring patients admitted under the team's care. Clinical supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr Janet Obeney-Williams and Dr Petros Lekkos
Main duties of the placement	When based at the in-patient ward, the F1 will ensure that all new patients admitted under the team's care are fully assessed, including an assessment of their physical state, so that a preliminary formulation of their problems is made. All in-patients should be reassessed as necessary and an update of their mental state made before each main ward round. The F1 will attend ward rounds and present new cases to the consultant. They will be involved in arranging and interpreting the results of various investigations. They will be involved in discharge planning. In the EIS you will participate in joint assessments, and out-patient clinics. Under the supervision of a clinical supervisor, they will prescribe treatments for the patients that they are working with. They will refer them promptly to other professionals as directed by their clinical supervisors.

Local education provider (LEP) / employer information	The employer will be Whittington NHS Trust but the post will be based in Camden & Islington NHS Foundation Trust which was established on 1st April 2008. Previously (since 1st April 2002) it had been one of the first Mental Health and Social Care Trusts in the country. The Trust is responsible for the provision of in-patient and community mental health services within the London Boroughs of Camden and Islington. This includes general adult mental health services (including rehabilitation, EIS, crisis and AOT services), services for ageing and mental health, an inpatient service for people with learning disabilities and substance misuse services.

Department	The Department of General surgery at the Whittington Hospital and consists of 10 consultants. The surgical specialties covered include emergency surgery, bariatric surgery, benign upper GI surgery, coloproctology, breast and vascular surgery. The F1 covers breast and vascular patients on ad hoc basis.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Ward based perioperative care for elective and emergency patients. Outpatient general surgery clinics, Emergency (on – call) cover Teaching and Audit. All the surgical F1 doctors are expected to attend to the ward based care of their allocated team's patients. There is also a rota for emergency on call duties, where F1's are expected to assist the Surgical Specialist Registrar in A&E. Theatre attendance as well as pre-assessment of patients who have elective procedures are also expected.
Where the placement is based	The surgical wards at the Whittington: most of the elective admissions are on Mercer Ward. Other surgical wards include Coyle and Thorogood (mainly orthopaedics). Surgical foundation doctors are responsible for all surgical patients managed by their teams.
Clinical supervisor(s) for the placement	Each F1 will have assigned to them a Clinical Supervisor as well as an Educational Supervisor. Both posts may be held by the same consultant. Mr Bhan, Mr Alhamdani, Mr Sufi, Mr Mukhtar, Mr Parmar, Mr Oshowo and Mr Wilson
Main duties of the placement	The F1 doctor is responsible alongside other staff, for the care of the patients on the surgical wards. It is highly important to maintain and keep a correct and updated patient's medical record on a regular basis. This should be done in conjunction with the SpR. There is a daily morning ward round which the F1 is expected to attend and scribe at. The F1 is expected to complete all the jobs generated from the ward round. The Core Trainees and / or SpR are always available for secondary support of the F1. Where this is not possible, the Clinical Supervisor must be informed as soon as possible. The F1 when on post take and on-call is expected to attend mandatory handovers daily and expected to keep patient worksheets and handover sheets up to date. They are to carry out post take ward round with consultants daily and assist Emergency team in management of non-elective patients in A&E and on wards.

	<p>Theatre attendance is highly encouraged but this may not be possible on a regular basis due to ward work schedule.</p> <p>There is also requirement to attend the OPD. This provides a useful educational experience and the F1 will be able to do their work based assessments at these opportunities.</p> <p>The vascular and breast cover may be required in exceptional circumstances. F1 will be asked to assist should there be any such need.</p> <p>You will be expected to attend the weekly departmental teaching (surgical forum).</p> <p>There are also regular MDT meetings and monthly morbidity and mortality meeting.
