<b>Department</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- All emergency medical admissions to the Hospital are admitted through the Acute Assessment Unit (AMU). After initial assessment and treatment on AMU, patients will either be admitted to a Specialty Medical Ward if they are thought to have a length of stay of greater than three days. We have five Consultant Physicians working in Acute Medicine to facilitate the running of AMU ward. Apart from the acute medical take, patients referred to acute medicine who are unlikely to require admission are assessed and treated on our busy Acute Care Unit or SDEC. All GIM consultants contribute to acute medical take.</li> <li>- When working on the Acute Medicine you will work several different shifts including long days, weekends and nights.</li> </ul>

With specialty input from consultants the experience you will gain in the management of medical conditions will be broad and exciting.</li> <li>- Medical students have junior and senior attachments in medicine and many later become F1/F2 doctors at the hospital. <b>Department</b>	Gastroenterology ward 7 South 7 Consultants, FY2, FY1's, supported by registrars.
<b>Type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>An FY1 on our gastroenterology ward plays a key role in the day-to-day management of inpatients under the supervision of senior doctors. The role involves assessing new and existing patients, reviewing clinical progress, and escalating concerns appropriately.</p> <p>Core responsibilities include coordinating and supporting consultant-led ward rounds, presenting patient histories and management plans, requesting and chasing investigations, and ensuring accurate and timely clinical documentation. The FY1 is responsible for carrying out jobs arising from ward rounds, including prescribing, arranging imaging and procedures, and supporting safe and timely discharge planning.</p> <p>The role requires regular communication with patients and their families to provide updates on diagnoses, investigations, and treatment plans. Close collaboration with the multidisciplinary team—including nursing staff, pharmacists, dietitians, specialist nurses, and allied health professionals—is essential, as is liaison with other specialty teams.</p> <p>The post provides broad exposure to common gastroenterology and hepatology conditions such as gastrointestinal bleeding, inflammatory bowel disease, liver disease, ascites, and infections, alongside the management of general medical patients. There are opportunities to develop practical skills, including venepuncture, cannulation, ascitic taps, and</p>

	<p>involvement in ascitic drain care, under appropriate supervision.</p> <p>The post will give opportunity to work on Audit, Quality Improvement Projects and teaching.</p> <p>The role develops core FY1 competencies in clinical assessment, communication, teamwork, prioritisation, and patient safety within a fast-paced medical environment.</p>

**Gastroenterology/Medical Outpatient service**

The department provides a comprehensive outpatient service for the full range of gastrointestinal illnesses including Dyspepsia, Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Irritable Bowel syndrome and Hepatology.

Around 500 patients are seen a year including around 1500 new attendances.

General gastroenterology and medical outpatient clinics are undertaken in the main outpatient department.

Adequate reception and nursing support is available for these clinics.

**General gastroenterology/medical inpatients**

The main gastroenterology ward is on 7 South with around 34 beds dedicated to gastroenterology.

Wards round are done daily by consultants supported by Registrars.

**Endoscopy service**

This includes a comprehensive range of endoscopic procedures including ERCP. Around 9 endoscopy lists a week are undertaken by Consultant Medical Gastroenterologists, supported by two Nurse Endoscopists.
