<b>Department</b>	<p>.</p> <p><b><u>Acute Medicine</u></b></p> <p>All emergency medical admissions to the Hospital are admitted through the Acute Assessment Unit (AMU). After initial assessment and treatment on AMU, patients will either be admitted to a Specialty Medical Ward if they are thought to have a length of stay of greater than three days. We have five Consultant Physicians working in Acute Medicine to facilitate the running of the medical take and AMU. Apart from the acute medical take, patients referred to acute medicine who are unlikely to require admission are assessed and treated on our busy Ambulatory Care Unit.</p> <p>When working on the Acute Medicine you will work several different shifts including twilights, long days, weekends and nights.</p> <p><b><u>Respiratory Medicine</u></b></p> <p>The busy respiratory department is based on 6S ward with enhanced care beds providing NIV in close liaison with Critical outreach team and ITU. There is excellent experience in full range of respiratory conditions with plenty of opportunity for training in procedures such as arterial line insertion and intercostal drain insertion.</p> <p>When working in Respiratory you will work several different shifts including twilights, long days, weekends and nights.</p> <p><b><u>Cardiology</u></b></p> <p>The busy Cardiology department is based on 4S ward with a 12 bedded CCU including close liaison with Critical outreach team and ITU. There is excellent experience in full range of cardiology conditions with plenty of opportunity for training in procedures such as arterial line insertion and central line insertion.</p>

<b>Type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p><b>Teaching and training</b></p> <p>Ealing Hospital is a designated associated teaching hospital of the Imperial College School of Medicine, University of London.</p> <p>Medical students have junior and senior attachments in medicine and many later become F1/F2 doctors at the hospital. There is an active postgraduate education department with weekly meetings in various specialties and a general weekly lunchtime meeting open to medical staff from all departments. The postgraduate centre has undergone extensive improvements in recent years with several well-appointed seminar rooms and a very well equipped library and literature search facility. Weekly grand rounds are held at Ealing Hospital including a monthly Schwartz round to develop the delivery of compassionate care. The medical directorate as well as specialty teams has clinical governance meetings as well as morbidity and mortality meetings.</p>

<b>Department</b>	<p>Anaesthetics The Critical Care provision within the Trust is based at both Northwick Park (NWP) and Ealing Hospital (EH).</p> <p>At EH, there are 9 ICU beds based on the third floor. There is a neighbouring 5 bay surgical recovery.</p> <p>The unit treats over &gt; 480 patients annually, of whom &gt; 1/3rd are ventilated. Approximately 80% are medical with a predicted mortality of close to 30%</p>
<b>Type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>Clinical – The junior doctor will be responsible for the regular clinical assessment and management of all patients, in conjunction with consultants and intensive care SAS doctors. Close supervision will be available at all times but incumbents of the posts will be trained and encouraged to develop initiative in clinical assessment, diagnosis and active management of their patients, rather than being limited to carrying out a daily list of tasks.</p> <p>Administrative – The junior doctor will have a prime responsibility for the regular and accurate documentation of history, examination, clinical progress, and results of investigations. This will include computerised record keeping, and an ability to cope with basic computer text entry will be expected. This role will also include the day-to-day audit of practice and standards of care.</p> <p>Communication – The junior doctor will work closely with nursing staff, physiotherapists and other associated health professionals, and act as a primary point of contact and referral with other medical teams and diagnostic services. Intensive care is a potentially stressful environment and much of the activity occurs out of hours. Appointees will be expected to communicate effectively and professionally at all times,</p>

The doctor will be encouraged to undertake audit and quality improvement projects. Support will be offered to pursue Membership examinations in their chosen specialty. (e) There are regular weekly MDTs sessions and a weekly grand round for the whole Trust. Audit takes place on an ongoing basis with monthly review. (f) There may be occasions when the doctor may have to perform duties in occasional emergencies and unforeseen circumstances. Commitments arising in such circumstances are, however, exceptional and the post holder will not be required to undertake work of this kind for prolonged periods or on a regular basis. All efforts will be made to ensure that work of this kind does not result in continuous hours of duty which exceed the new deal continuous hours of duty limits.

Around 500 patients are seen a year including around 1500 new attendances.</p> <p>General gastroenterology and medical outpatient clinics are undertaken in the main outpatient department. Adequate reception and nursing support is available for these clinics.</p> <p><b>General gastroenterology/medical inpatients</b></p> <p>The main gastroenterology ward is on 7 South with around 26 beds dedicated to gastroenterology. Wards round are done daily by registrars supported by Consultant ward rounds twice weekly by each of the consultants.</p> <p>The Gastroenterology team is on-take 1 in 5 and post take rounds during weekdays is done by Acute Medicine consultants and at weekends are done by the Gastroenterology team Consultants.</p> <p><b>Endoscopy service</b></p> <p>This includes a comprehensive range of endoscopic procedures including ERCP. Around 9 endoscopy lists a week are undertaken by Consultant Medical Gastroenterologists, supported by two Nurse Endoscopists.</p>
