Supervision

Faculty Tutor

 Responsible to Faculty for ensuring quality training and education within individual units (larger units may have more than one)

Educational Supervisor

- Responsible for working with you to ensure educational goals, paperwork etc. are being achieved
- Provides ES structured report and signing off competencies

Clinical Supervisor

 Responsible for ensuring safe and effective care on a daily basis, e.g. consultant on call, consultant of the week etc.

In some units all three roles may be the same individual



Educational Supervisor (ES)

- Must have ICM ES for each placement whether in an ICM programme post or partner specialty.
- Coordinated by the Faculty Tutor in each Trust
- Oversee training with consistency & clarity.
- ES must: Have e-portfolio (LLP) access
 Be familiar with ICU curriculum
 Understand ARCP requirements
- Talk to the Regional Advisor for your Trust if having problems



Supervision - Regional Advisor

- Responsible to FICM to ensure effective work force planning within their sector.
- Signing Faculty registration forms with TPD.
- Issue end of stage certificates
- Career advice.
- Ensures each unit in sector is maintaining high educational and clinical training.
- Approval of consultant posts, present on consultant interview panels.
- Annual statement of activity to the FICM



Supervision – TPD's

- Responsible to Head of School to ensure adequate delivery of training and rotations to each trainee.
- Planning bespoke training timeline for each trainee
- Trainee appointment and progression
- Ensuring adequate training posts within London and working to secure further post to provide quality training.
- Work with other specialty TPDs to ensure dual CCT rotations are completed.
- Specialty training committee



Supervision – who can help me?

- Educational Supervisors
- Faculty Tutors
- Training Program Directors
- Regional Advisors
- Head of School/ Deputy Head of School & Post Graduate
 Dean have ultimate responsibility and will participate in any
 ARCP that will have an outcome that may result in an
 extension of CCT date etc.



Principals of good educational supervision


- YOU must take responsibility for YOUR training.
 - Don't expect ES to chase around to ensure WBPA/SLE's etc. are completed.
 - If you don't keep up with paperwork then it WILL be spotted at ARCP, therefore start early.
- Remember the GMC domains of being a good doctor also refer to educational supervision



What do I do at each ES Meeting?

- **Initial Meeting**
 - Introduction to unit etc.
 - Look at FICM curriculum, get to know it well!
 Set up initial goals and needs list
- Mid Point Meeting (ideally)
 - "How are things progressing, am I half way there"
 - Am going to meet my goals from previous meetings?
- End of Placement Review/Sign Off
 - Reflection on past 3,6 or 12 months.
 - End of Stage needs: ESSR, competencies signed off, MSF summary released
 - Not the point to realise that an MSF and 26 CBDs are missing!!!

Lifelong Learning Platform Do's & Don'ts...

Curriculum and WPBA all electronic

- ARCP outcome linked to pro rata ICM portfolio completion
- Only linked with anaesthetic portfolios. Runs in parallel with other portfolios for dual specialty trainees.
- Evidence produced on one portfolio can be printed and scanned into another if need be.
- Be prepared to be able to access other portfolios at ES meetings
- Can use any evidence post Foundation for stage 1 HiLLO's



What exams will I need to pass?

- All trainees entering the program now will be under 2021 curriculum.
- COVID derogation program entry. Core training exam within 1 year
- FFICM is undertaken in stage 2
- Compulsory pass in FFICM examination to proceed to Stage 3 training.
- FFICM Examination
 - MCQ
 - OSCE
 - Final SOE
- July and January for MCQ paired to October and March for OSCE/SOE



Tips for FFICM Exam

- Don't underestimate the depth of knowledge required!
 - http://www.ficm.ac.uk/sites/default/files/document-files/FFICM-Examination-Guide.pdf
- Need to have Stage 1 signed off and certificated to apply.
- Look around for local, regional and national teaching and revision courses





When am I not in-training?

- Out of Programme with prospective approval
- Statutory/Parental Leave
- Sick Leave



What out of programme opportunities exist?


- OOPT Training in a clinical post
 - outside a recognised training programme
- OOPR Undertake higher degree (max 3 years)
 - may count up to 1 year towards training
- OOPE experience out of programme
 - not counting towards training
- OOPC- Career break
- OOPP Pause (NHS non- training post- up to 1 year and competencies may be gained towards training)



OOP

- Not normally permitted in stage 1 training or last 6 months pre CCT.
- Application through support portal: https://lasepgmdesupport.hee.nhs.uk/support/tickets/new?form_d35= true
- Apply for approval <u>6 months</u> prior to start of OOP to stage TPD (plus dual TPD if applicable)
- RA and FICM approval for OOPT
- Submit to college with supporting evidence for OOPT and OOPR
 - >6 months in advance of OOP start
 - FICM recommend approval to deanery
- Deanery submits to GMC for approval







Can I train Less than Full Time LTFT)?

- Category 1: Automatically eligible parenting, carer, health
- Category 2: Requests that do not fit under category 1 criteria. Considered on a case by case basis by PG Dean. (1 year)
- Category 3: Personal choice (time limited 80% with window's of application)


Discuss early with TPD (**both if dual**). Application through PGMDE support portal.

What constitutes Standalone ICM Training?





Stages of training

Stage 1

4 years (MINIMUM & includes core training) consisting of 12 months each of

ICM, Anaesthesia and Acute/Emergency Medicine

Stage 2

2 years (MINIMUM) consisting of specialty modules Cardiac, Paediatrics, Neurology Including 1 year Special Skills Year* OR your partner specialty

Stage 3

1 year general ICM



SSY Options

What if I want to dual train?

- Inform ICM TPD as soon as you know;
 - You are intending to apply
 - The outcome of your application
- Applications to dual specialty up to end ST5 level
- Inform you have an ICM NTN on application
- ≥ 3 months notice if not taking up an ICM post
- Programme organised by ICM & dual TPDs
- <u>Dual CCT guidance is found on the FICM website in</u>
 "Curriculum Assessment and Training" section please
 familiarise yourself.



I am an HST Anaesthesia Trainee and I want to dual train – what do I do?

- Inform Anaesthesia TPD as soon as you know;
 - You are intending to apply
 - The outcome of your application
- Inform you have an Anaesthesia NTN on application
- Programme organised by ICM & Anaesthesia TPDs
- <u>Dual CCT guidance is found on the FICM website in</u>
 "Curriculum Assessment and Training" section please
 familiarise yourself.



Annual Review of Competency Progression (ARCP) for ICM? What, When & How...

- Required annually
 - Even if you have not done any posts in ICM programme in last 12 months!
- In absentia
- Organised by HEE LASE and TPDs
- Monitors progress with curriculum pro rata
- Provides evidence for PG Dean to recommend revalidation
- You will be provided with 8 weeks notice (they are throughout the year- aim to allign with end of stage)



ARCP "Must Haves"

You will be provided with a checklist of requirements and instruction on how to lay out your portfolio - please follow them

- Completed Form R
- ES report for each placement/module
- Educational Supervisors Structured report covering the <u>whole year</u> since last ARCP
- Academic supervisor report for Academic Clinical Fellows
- OOP report if appropriate
- Up to date LLP
- Logbook summary (FICM format)
- MSF summary report/Journal club/QIPP
- Summary: meetings, Regional Training Days



Enhanced form R

- Online form.
- Essential for revalidation
- London PG Dean is your responsible officer
- Critical Incidents common in ICM
- Most trainees will declare at some point
- Not an indicator of concern
- Declare ALL work





Regional Training Days

- 10 half days annually, 2 year rolling programme.
- Need to book in order to receive attendance certificate
- https://london.hee.nhs.uk/calender4
- Remotely delivered for time being (COVID)
- Organised by Dr de la Cerda and RA's
- Mandatory must attend 6 minimum per annum.
- Book your study leave early.



Study Leave

- Health Education England Process

 - Follow local application processes for approval
 - Mandated and Optional events
 - "Aspirational" events need TPD sign off before escalation to HoS
 - 30 days per annum

How can I pursue an Health Education England academic career in Intensive Care?

ACF

- Can apply as an ST2 or ST3
- Funded 25% of your time research for 3 years
- Previous training recognised
- In theory no extension to training required.
- Provides grounding in research
- Prepares for PhD in ICM post ACF
- Clinical placements arranged by clinical TPD in locality of research placement



Academic Intensive Care

- ACL
 - Must already have a PhD to apply
 - Postdoctoral research career development
 - Clinician Scientist Award or Intermediate Fellowship
 - 50% clinical: 50% Research until CCT (4 years)
