<b>Department</b>	Haringey Council Public Health Team works to improve health and reduce inequalities across the borough through evidence-based interventions, policy development, and partnership working.
<b>Type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>This non-clinical placement provides experience of population health and wider determinants of health. Learning opportunities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shadowing public health consultants and specialists</li> <li>• Contributing to project work (e.g., needs assessments, health equity audits, service reviews, project evaluations)</li> <li>• Attending Health and Wellbeing Board or partnership meetings</li> <li>• Contribution to health protection incident management and outbreak control</li> <li>• Presenting findings to the team and external partners</li> </ul> <p>This placement will incorporate 60 hours which will be dedicated to the Enhance Explore programme along with a QI project. London is particularly focussing on the leadership component of the programme which includes domains in person centred practice, complex multi-morbidity, systems working, population health, health equity and environmental sustainability. <b>Main duties of the placement</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Contribute to a defined public health project (e.g., sexual health, obesity, mental health, substance use)</li> <li>• Assist with data analysis and interpretation for reports and presentations</li> <li>• Attend and observe strategic meetings with NHS, local authority, and voluntary sector partners</li> </ul>

<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Monday to Friday, 09:00–17:00 (office-based with flexibility for remote working)</li> <li>• No on-call, nights, or weekend work</li> <li>• Regular supervision meetings with the Educational Supervisor</li> <li>• Attendance at team meetings and relevant external meetings</li> <li>• Protected time for self-directed learning and completion of ePortfolio requirements</li> </ul>

<b>Local education provider (LEP) / employer information</b>	Haringey Council Public Health Team is part of the London Borough of Haringey. The team collaborates with NHS partners, voluntary sector organisations, and council departments to improve health outcomes for a diverse population. Opportunities can be arranged for F2s to shadow Council services relevant to public health, including homelessness, substance use, violence against women services.
