Training Details

(Description of post)

This post is suitable for those who wish to undertake specialist training in orthodontics and will prepare the individual for the Membership in Orthodontics examination of the Royal Colleges. The post offers broad experience in all aspects of orthodontics and provides an exciting opportunity to be involved in providing orthodontic services to the local community. Duties include clinical sessions, and involvement in teaching and mentoring more junior staff. The post holder will be expected to treat a range of patients in accordance with departmental guidelines. The post holder will be encouraged to develop their clinical skills and progress in the post, taking on increasingly complex patients and caseload. Whilst service delivery is important, contributions to the wider Trust/s in fields such as audit, outcomes, research management and teaching will be encouraged.

The post will be based at Queen Mary's Hospital, Sidcup and Guys' and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust (within the Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences).

As an employee of the Trust you will work in close co-operation with, and support other clinical, dental professional and managerial colleagues in providing high quality healthcare to the Trust's patients. Integral to these responsibilities is the following:-

- The provision of a first-class clinical service
- Effective leadership to all staff engaged in the specialty
- Sustaining and developing teaching and research in conjunction with King's College London
- Undertaking all work in accordance with the Trust's procedures and operating policies
- Conducting clinical practice in accordance with contractual requirements and within the parameters of the Trust's service plans
- Maintaining the confidence of business plans and development strategies formulated for the specialty, the Care Group or the Trust

Duties and Responsibilities of postholder

The post holder will be given the opportunity to treat orthodontic cases with a range of appliances with the laboratory back up of experienced orthodontic technicians. Cephalometric computer software is available. Weekly orthognathic joint clinics allow discussion and treatment planning with maxillofacial colleagues.

Specialty specific

- Participate in weekly joint orthognathic and multi-disciplinary outpatient clinics as outlined above. This will include planning surgical predictions using Dolphin imaging software.
- Undertake personal treatment of cases in conjunction with Consultants for more complex cases, such as: orthognathic cases, hypodontia cases and complex orthodontic treatments involving multidisciplinary care as well as patients with special needs.

- Manage patients appropriately throughout their treatment and for a year post debond.
- Actively participate in the departmental teaching programme
- Manage patients who present with, or develop, complications as a result of their condition

Participate in the audit programme. Audit is incorporated into a regional programme with other Orthodontic departments and forms part of our “protected time”. There are also combined mortality and morbidity meetings with maxillofacial surgery and hospital-wide inter-departmental audit meetings, held bi-monthly.

Description of main training site

The Department of Orthodontics at Queen Mary Hospital, Sidcup forms part of King's Dental Services within King's Health Partners, working in partnership with Dental Services at Guy's & St Thomas' and the Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences at King's College London. The partnership provides services at multiple locations but principally at QM, GSTT and KCL.

The present Queen Mary's Hospital was opened in 1974, and is set within pleasant leafy grounds on the edge of the outer South East London green belt. The hospital has easy access due to its close proximity to a trunk road network comprising the A20, M20, and M25. There is a good train service to Central London taking between 20-40 minutes.

Recently the orthodontic department has moved to a new and modern unit called the Gillies Unit, which is situated on the second floor of the main hospital block. The unit consists of 15 separated dental surgeries, a cone beam CT scanner and a dental laboratory on site.

The Oxlea's Foundation NHS Trust manages Queen Mary's hospital, Sidcup site while King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust manages the services for Orthodontics, Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, Oral Medicine, and Restorative Dentistry. In addition, there is continued provision of Outpatients and Diagnostic services in addition, to the Urgent Care Centre for minor injuries, which serves the local Bexley community.

Description of second training site

King's Health Partners (KHP) comprises King's College London, Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust, King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust and is one of just five accredited UK Academic Health Sciences Centres (AHSCs). Referrals are accepted from general dental practitioners, general medical practitioners, paediatricians and other medical and dental specialists.
