Training Details

(Description of post)

This post is suitable for those who wish to further develop their practice in orthodontics and undertake training to consultant level. The post offers a broad experience of all aspects of orthodontics and provides an exciting opportunity to develop and enhance the services provided to the local community. Duties include both clinic and MDT meetings, with involvement in teaching and mentoring more junior staff.

The post holder is expected to treat a range of patients in accordance with departmental guidelines. The post holder will be encouraged to develop their clinical skills and progress in the post, taking on increasingly complex patients and caseload. Whilst service delivery is important, contributions to the wider Trust in fields such as audit, outcomes, research management and teaching will be encouraged.



Duties and Responsibilities of post-holder

- Management of a range of complex malocclusions specifically chosen as appropriate to additional specialist training, including those requiring interdisciplinary management.
- Provide teaching and clinical training for undergraduates, postgraduates and career junior hospital staff.

- Support and development of skills of Orthodontic Therapists and other Dental Health Care Professionals.
- Involvement in audit and journal club meetings and to foster a commitment to evidencebased practice.

There is potential for research leading to publications and other methods for the dissemination of knowledge.

Audit/Research

Description of main training site

University Hospitals Sussex (Brighton)

Paediatric and neonatal care is provided at Brighton, Chichester and Worthing.

The specialised and tertiary services provided at the Royal Sussex County Hospital in Brighton include neurosciences, arterial vascular surgery, neonatal, paediatrics, cardiac, cancer, renal, infectious diseases and HIV medicine. It is also the major trauma centre for Sussex and the South East.

In Chichester, we operate a purpose-built NHS Treatment Centre on site which offers safe, fast, prebooked day and short stay surgery and diagnostic procedures.

In Worthing, our Breast Care Centre is equipped with the latest digital diagnostic equipment, which enables the provision of a much-improved breast screening and symptomatic service to women in a warm and welcoming, purpose-built environment.

Southlands Hospital specialises in day-case procedures, ophthalmology care and outpatient appointments and services provided from Brighton General Hospital include dermatology, physiotherapy and outpatient appointments.

The Department of Orthodontics

Since 2014 Orthodontic services are delivered from both the newly developed Dental Centre (Children's Dentistry & Orthodontics) at St Thomas' and the new Postgraduate Centre at Guy's. Cleft Lip and Palate Services are located at St Thomas' hospital in a purpose designed area.

Provision of orthodontic treatment is, apart from cleft services, located at Guy's Hospital. The main aim of the department is provision of a specialist service in orthodontics: We are the largest provider of level IIIa and IIIb treatments in the area. Services are delivered by consultants, Orthodontic therapists, Post CCT trainees and postgraduate students (national and international). A specialist service is provided for a wide range of patients, including children with learning difficulties or physical disability and inherited anomalies of the jaws and detention. Referrals are accepted from general dental practitioners, general medical practitioners, Paediatricians and other medical and dental specialists.

We are committed to implementing paperless patient records, including 3D study models. We have used virtual models for over three years and have nearly completely abandoned the use of plaster models. The department offers temporary anchorage devices, lingual fixed appliances as well as aligner treatment where indicated.

GSTT are also hosting the academic department, which is engaged in education and clinical training of postgraduate dental students as well as the pursuit of research and scholarship.
