Department	Acute Medicine consultants from a range of clinical specialities, 12-15 Core trainees (GP VTS, Internal Medicine, ACCS and clinical fellows), 2-3 FY2 and 3-5 FY1s who cover the Acute admissions (medical take), Acute Medical Unit (AMU) and Ambulatory care (except for FY1s). Each area has a duty consultant of the day and a team of 3-4 junior doctors.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Consultant ward rounds every morning on the MAU for patients admitted on the acute medical take, ongoing care of these patients including clinical reviews, practical procedures, organizing investigations and coordinating discharges. F1s on MAU are also on the acute medical take rota. Department	<p>There are 4-5 endocrinology and diabetes consultants, who have general medical inpatients for 12 months of the year. Specialty patients are also managed on the ward if requiring inpatient care.</p> <p>The junior doctor inpatient team is currently made up of: 1 SpR</p>

	(rotating around 3 endocrinology and diabetes specialty trainees and 1 renal medicine trainee); 1 GPVTS doctor; 2 F1 doctors (including this post). In August 2024, the team will also be welcoming a new F2 doctor post.
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>You will be the link between the team and the inpatients as you will see them regularly (SpRs and consultants work on a rota covering the ward). You are also the link between the family and the medical team, as families often are not on the ward in the morning during ward rounds. You will be updating the inpatient handover list and ensuring the plans the consultant and senior doctors advise get put into action, so you may be interacting with many departments in the hospital. Most of the inpatients are elderly so you will therefore attend MDTs to discuss discharge planning, including daily board rounds with senior nursing staff, occupational- and physio-therapists, and discharge planning coordinators.</p> <p>Inpatients with specialty endocrinology or diabetes related conditions are prioritised to be transferred to the team's ward. Experience is therefore gained in managing these specialty patients. In addition, during quieter periods it may be possible to attend specialty and sub-specialty outpatient clinics.</p>

The F1 doctors on the team are the first point of contact for nursing and therapy staff and for patients and their carers. They also liaise with other specialty teams, including presenting at specialty MDTs. They also communicate with clinicians outside the hospital, such as in primary care or other hospital trusts. • Medical on calls. On call duties include clerking and formulating a management plan for acutely presenting patients; case presentation to and discussion with either Duty Medical Registrar or supervising consultant. • Ward cover. Duties include care of patients on the general medical wards and Medical Assessment Unit depending on the rota and the required jobs handed over.

Main duties of the placement	The FY1 is responsible, along with other staff, for the ward care of patients and the maintenance of the patient's medical record. They are expected to attend the structured teaching programmes provided by the department and that provided by the Department of Postgraduate Medical Education. The doctor will be responsible for such other specific clinical duties as allocated by consultants such as attending MDTs and presenting at journal club.

Department	<p>The Department of General surgery at the Whittington Hospital consists of 10 consultants.</p> <p>The surgical specialties covered include emergency surgery, bariatric surgery, benign upper GI surgery, coloproctology, breast and vascular surgery. The F1 covers breast and vascular patients on ad hoc basis.</p>
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ward based perioperative care for elective and emergency patients. • Outpatient general surgery clinics, Emergency (on – call) cover Teaching and Audit. • All the surgical F1 doctors are expected to attend to the ward-based care of their allocated team’s patients. • There is also a rota for emergency on call duties, where F1’s are expected to assist the Surgical Specialist Registrar in A&E. • Theatre attendance, as well as pre-assessment of patients who have elective procedures, are also expected.
Where the placement is based	<p>The surgical wards at the Whittington: most of the elective admissions are on Mercer Ward. Other surgical wards include Coyle and Thorogood (mainly orthopaedics).</p> <p>Surgical foundation doctors are responsible for all surgical patients managed by their teams.</p>

Main duties of the placement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The F1 doctor is responsible alongside other staff, for the care of the patients on the surgical wards. It is highly important to maintain and keep a correct and updated patient’s medical

	<p>record on a regular basis. This should be done in conjunction with the SpR.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a daily morning ward round which the F1 is expected to attend and scribe at. • The F1 is expected to complete all the jobs generated from the ward round. The Core Trainees and / or SpR are always available for secondary support of the F1. Where this is not possible, the Clinical Supervisor must be informed as soon as possible. • The F1 when on post take and on-call is expected to attend mandatory handovers daily and expected to • keep patient worksheets and handover sheets up to date. • They are to carry out post take ward round with consultants daily and assist Emergency team in management of non-elective patients in A&E and on wards. • Theatre attendance is highly encouraged but this may not be possible on a regular basis due to ward work schedule. • There is also requirement to attend the OPD. This provides a useful educational experience and the F1 will be able to do their work-based assessments at these opportunities. • The vascular and breast cover may be required in exceptional circumstances. F1 will be asked to assist should there be any such need. • You will be expected to attend the weekly departmental teaching (surgical forum). • There are also regular MDT meetings and monthly morbidity and mortality meeting. Department	<p>There are 9 consultants, 3 registrars, 2 internal medicine trainees, 1 GPVTS and 7 F1s. There are 3 acute COOP wards.</p> <p>We run an acute frailty service at the front door and specialist liaison services within Orthopaedics and Surgery.</p> <p>We also run an integrated community aging service offering CGA in peoples own homes.</p> <p>The FY1s work with a team comprising consultant, registrar, CMT/GPVTS and 2 FY1s.</p> <p>During the winter months there is additional support at SHO level.</p>
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>You will work as part of medical team looking after approx. 20-24 elderly patients. There will be excellent opportunities to see a large variety of general medical presentations and learn about the management of the complex frail elderly patient. Alongside this you will become confident in management of multiple common GIM presentations.</p> <p>You will also learn about COOP specific issues including DNAR decisions, ethical problems, discharge planning, MDT working (PT/OT/SALT/MHCOP, pharmacists, etc.).</p> <p>There will also be opportunities to teach and support UCL medical students.</p> <p>You will also be on the acute take rota along with ward cover.</p>

Department	<p>The Critical Care Unit at the Whittington has capacity for 10 acutely unwell medical or post-surgical patients who require advanced care. Patients requiring complex monitoring and support for several failing organ systems are designated 'level 3 care' - intensive care - whereas patients who need less support but are too sick for a ward are 'level 2 care' - high dependency, and we look after both level 2 and 3 patients.</p> <p>Additionally, the critical care outreach service, which operates seven days a week, visits the wards to follow-up recovering patients recently discharged from the unit as well as assessing at risk of deteriorating. Early intervention on the ward can avert deterioration and avoid the need for critical care admission.</p> <p>The critical care unit is located in purpose-built premises in a new building, closely linked to the emergency department, operating theatres and the admissions ward.</p> <p>We provide all the necessary support for the sickest and most unstable patients who may need ventilation to support breathing, cardio-vascular support for shock and dialysis for renal failure. Patients receive round the clock nursing care and our doctors are always resident in the unit. In addition, a critical care consultant is continuously on duty. The hospital's microbiologists, radiologists, physiotherapists, nutritionists, speech and language therapists and pharmacy also provide their essential input.</p>
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The F1 will be expected to be on the unit between 0800 and 1600, prepare the patients and documentation for morning handover, assist on the ward round and carry out any jobs generated. During the day there is the opportunity to learn about organ support systems, assess critically unwell patients with a structured approach and learn practical procedures including arterial and central line placement. There is an opportunity for those interested to go to theatres occasionally to assist in induction of anaesthesia and acquiring airway skills. There is also exposure to complex ethical and medico-legal problems and exposure to organ donation. Further there is the opportunity to undertake audit and teaching work, including teaching on HELP courses and to be part of the critical care outreach team for a week.</p>
