## Local Allocation Process followed in 2020 (This may be subject to alteration for 2022).

The central recruitment process will allocate you, if appropriate, to the Cardiff & Barry DFT scheme. All schemes in Wales hold a Meet the Educational Supervisor event in order to establish which individual practice an applicant will be allocated to. The process involves all applicants meeting all Educational Supervisors at a designated Meet the Educational Supervisor event. The Cardiff & Barry Meet the Educational Supervisor event will take place on the 13th of <u>July 2022 at Education Centre</u>, University Hospital Llandough, Penlan Road, Penarth, Cardiff CF64 2XX.

Each Educational Supervisor will promote their practice to the applicant and the applicant can consider if the practice is suitable as their DFT placement. Information on each training practice will be made available on the day of the event to help describe the practice and the local area.

Following the exchange of practice and applicant information, all applicants will rank all Educational Supervisors in order of preference and the Educational Supervisors will do the same. A matching system will then take account of the Educational Supervisor and applicant preferences and match the applicant to a training practice.

If you are allocated to the Cardiff & Barry scheme, the Dental Foundation Training Manager will send you further information in June 2022.

## Overview

The Cardiff & Barry scheme is very popular for those who wish to work in a busy city. The scheme has proved to be a popular scheme over the years due to the convenience of its location and the outstanding practices in this area.

Cardiff boasts a wide range of cultural and international sporting opportunities and is a lively, elegant city catering for all tastes. From the excitement of a vibrant city life to the peace and tranquility of the nearby coast and countryside, the attractive Brecon Beacons National Park is conveniently close. Cardiff is the home to the Principality Stadium and many legislative buildings. It is a city with both heritage and ambition and benefits from excellent road, rail and airport links. Many trainees, upon completion of their training year, are happy to settle within the area.

The Study Day centre for the Cardiff & Barry Scheme is based in the Postgraduate Centre at Llandough Hospital, which is situated approximately 4 miles from Cardiff city centre, the capital city of Wales.

The Dental Postgraduate Centre is situated within the Academic Building of Llandough Hospital, which has easy access and plenty of parking on site. The Centre has excellent facilities, including dental units for hands-on training and fully equipped lecture and seminar rooms, IT facilities and library. There are canteen and restaurant facilities within the hospital complex.

The Cardiff & Barry scheme has a mixture of seminar presentations, workshops, and multiple 'hands-on' sessions, practice visits and residential conferences. Topics are varied, and subject to constant review, but may typically include an initial clinical skills hands-on refresher session, Child Protection, Oral Surgery, Health and Safety, Endodontics, Ethical and Legal Issues, Financial Management and Understanding the NHS Regulations, plus many other subjects.

This scheme offers opportunities to develop and expand your range of clinical skills and build your confidence in a supportive environment.

All Welsh schemes offer Foundation Dentists the chance to complete additional learning opportunities such as Quality Improvement projects, specifically IQT Bronze and Designed to Smile, which are a positive addition to your CV.

The Training Programme Director, Richard Jones, has worked in General Dental Practice since 1994, being part of the first compulsory Vocational Training cohort. He has been a Partner in practice for over 20 years having also worked in Morriston Hospital's Restorative department from 1995 to 2003 as a Clinical Assistant. His dental practice has also been heavily involved with contract reform. Currently he also works for 2 Health Boards as a Primary Care Dental Practice Advisor and is a Dental Tutor with HEIW. He will provide you with support to practice safely within your own competence levels.
