The training is undertaken within the Barking, Havering, Redbridge University Trust and includes Queen's Hospital, Romford, Barking Hospital and King George's hospital, Goodmayes. The North East London Foundation Trust provides the mental health services and St Francis' Hospice provides the palliative care services for the patch.

This is a one-year fixed term placement. If you fail to meet the progression criteria below, no additional training time, extensions or remediation will be available.

Progression to the next stage of the programme is subject to:

- Continued satisfactory progression.
- Attainment of foundation competences by the end of the training year (completion of the CREST form is required).
- Meeting General Practice national selection benchmarking requirements.
 - You will be required to submit an application to the General Practice national selection centre in February 2022 in order to attend for assessment in March/April 2022
